Western Wayne School Technology Initiatives

Lincoln Middle/High School initiated a 1:1 transition in August of 2014. Students in grades 11 and 12 use an Asus T100TA Transformer Tablets. Students in grades 6-10 use chromebooks. A sustainable plan for implementing Chromebooks in all grade levels has been initiated. High school students are able to take their devices home each day, while middle school students leave their devices at school.

Western Wayne Elementary School has recently purchased additional devices and most classrooms have are equipped to allow at least one device for every two students.

The school currently has iPads in kindergarten and first grade and Chromebooks in grades 2-5.

The following is a list of several other current technology initiatives taking place throughout Western Wayne Schools:

- Google Docs, Classroom, and Drive are available to all students and staff K-12
- The use of social media is being integrated into classroom use by teachers who have undergone professional development on the proper use of social media in an educational setting. Western Wayne Schools utilizes the hashtag #wweagles to share their learning experiences and celebrate successes.
- Staff are using Weebly.com to create their own classroom websites to embody the importance of online communication, and to reach levels of organization that were not possible in the past
- The school district has provided the majority of the classroom teachers with interactive smart boards
